Range Address: Winnsboro Gun Club is located at 2882 LA-865 in Winnsboro, Louisiana.

Tournament: The LAPUA Winnsboro Open is a one-day air rifle silhouette regional championship (Friday) and a two-day smallbore silhouette rifle regional championship (Saturday & Sunday). The Air Rifle Regional Championship on Friday will consist of three 40-shot matches (Open, Target and Sporter Air Rifle). The Smallbore Regional Championship will consist of two 40-shot Standard Smallbore Rifle matches on Saturday and two 40-shot Smallbore Hunting Rifle matches on Sunday.

Eligibility & Registration: NRA membership is not required. Shooters may pre-register for the smallbore matches by mail using the attached entry form. Smallbore shooters may register at the match if space is available. **THE SMALLBORE MATCH IS LIMITED TO THE FIRST 120 ENTRIES!** Air Rifle registration is onsite only; there is no pre-registration for the air rifle matches. Air rifle entries are unlimited and squadding will be accommodated.

Classification: The NRA Silhouette Classification System applies to all matches. A current classification book is required. Shooters without a current classification book will be required to purchase one at the match and present proof of current classification or shoot in the highest classification.

Entry Fees: Smallbore: \$50 for first rifle, \$50 for second rifle. Juniors shoot one or both rifles for \$50 total. Air Rifle: \$25 flat fee for one, two or three rifles. Juniors pay \$15.

Ties: Ties will be decided as follows:

- Aggregate Champion (160 shots) – five-shot shootoff on turkeys with hunter rifle.
- Match winner (80 shots) – five-shot shootoff on turkeys.
- Class winners – sudden-death shootoff
- High Woman – sudden-death shootoff
- High Junior – sudden-death shootoff
- High Senior – sudden-death shootoff

Coon-Ass Team Shoot: The coon-ass team shoot is a team event. Each team consists of 4 shooters. Shooters are classified based on their smallbore standard or hunter classification, whichever is highest. Entry fee is \$5/shooter and money is put into the pot. Each team assigns each of its shooters a particular target (chickens, pigs, turkeys or rams). Shooters take 10 shots at their targets; each hit counts as a point. AAA class shooters have 1 point added to their total. AA class shooters have 2 points added to their total. A class shooters have 3 points added to their total. B class shooters have 4 points added to their total. (Master class shooters have no points added to their score.) The team with the most total points wins the pot.

Chicken Challenge: The Chicken Challenge costs \$3/shooter with all entry fees put into the pot. The object is to shoot a chicken off the rail at the ram line. Masterclass shooters get 1 shot per round to hit a chicken. AAA class shooters get 2 shots per round. AA class shooters get 3 shots per round. A class shooters get 4 shots per round. B class shooters get 5 shots per round. Every shooter that knocks a chicken off the rail moves on to the next round. If no shooter in a particular round hits, all shooters in that round shoot again. The last shooter standing wins the pot.

Terrible Turkey Throwdown: The Terrible Turkey Throwdown costs \$2 to enter with all entry fees put into the pot. Shooters are classified based on their smallbore standard or hunter classification, whichever is highest. Shooters take 5 shots at turkeys with the shooter hitting the most winning the pot. B & A class shooters shoot at turkeys on the chicken line. AA class shooters shoot at turkeys on the pig line. AAA class shooters shoot at turkeys on the turkey line. Master class shooters shoot at turkeys on the ram line. If there is a tie, those tied for the most hits move onto the next round and shoot 5 more shots. At the end of each round, a shooter may opt to pay \$2 more to the pot and take 5 more shots to attempt to tie or beat the current top shooter.
